**THE ENDINGS OF THE SYNOPTIC GOSPELS**

**MATTHEW**

Matthew closes his gospel out with an explanation of how the chief priests and the elders devised a plan to cover up the resurrection. Matthew tells of a bribe that was paid to the Roman soldiers to tell the lie that the disciples came during the night and stole the body of Jesus. Matthew ends his discourse with the Great Commission given by Jesus, "Go ye therefore and teach all nations...and lo I am with you always, even unto the end of the age."

**MARK**

Mark tells of more appearances by the Risen Christ, also gives his version of the Great Commission, then tells of the ascension of Jesus into heaven, and the eventual spread of Christianity by those early church apostles.

**LUKE**

Luke closes out his Gospel with the story of the two men from Emmaus. As they were walking, they encountered the risen Christ. As they talked with Him, they related questions that they had concerning the killing of Jesus of Nazareth. Jesus revealed the scriptures to them, and the men invited Him to dine with them. It was then that they realized who He was, and asked that famous question, "Were not our hearts burning within us when he talked to us and opened the scriptures to us?"

The men went to the 11 disciples and conveyed the experience to them. While there, Jesus came and revealed to them that he was, indeed, alive by showing them the marks on his hands and his feet.

Luke closes his gospel, telling how Jesus blessed the disciples while He ascended into heaven, and how the disciples continued in Jerusalem worshipping Him with great joy.
